The Post Classic Racing Association of NSW are proud to announce that the 2010 Barry Sheene Festival of Speed has been booked for the 3rd – 4th April at the Eastern Creek International Raceway.

The Barry Sheene Festival of Speed is the biggest historic motorcycle event on the NSW road racing calendar & 2010 will be no exception.

After the successful appearance of Graeme Crosby & Kork Ballington in 2009, a number of former 500cc Grand Prix racers have been approached to participate in next years event.

For 2010, the format of the main feature race the, 'Barry Sheene Memorial' has been revised. Comprising of the top 40 riders on pre-1980 bikes, it will now be contested over two heats of six laps.

Further proposed changes to the race format in a number of other classes will provide for very competitive fields & exciting racing.

In addition to exciting racing, the weekend will also provide some off track activities with various Trade/Club displays & Sunday's Show 'n' Shine competition.

Secure on-site camping will again be offered for up to 100 competitors & officials from Thursday to Saturday nights, with access to the pit garages open from Thursday night.

Once again the PCRA aim to raise the profile of the event with the aid of its media partners AMCN and Sydney radio station WFSM.

This meeting is run by the Post Classic Racing Association of NSW, a volunteer run, not for profit organisation that donates a percentage of the money raised from this race meeting to the Prostate Cancer Foundation & back into club racing.
